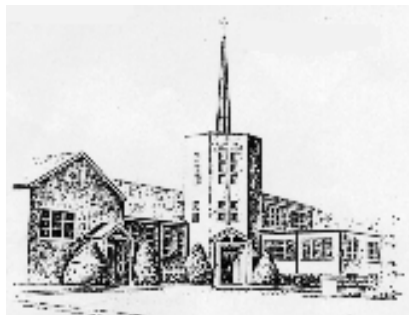

# ELEVATOR PROJECT

## Report on the Pre Campaign Survey Interviews

Staff of the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation interviewed 39 of us from 26 households about our feelings about the elevator and entry project. About 40 of us attended the report session Oct. 15. We heard a fairly high level of enthusiasm for the project and a consensus that this was the right time to do it. 27 thought we could raise the \$200,000 necessary from gifts and 3 year pledges to make the project a success. 6 said no and 6 were uncertain. 37 out of those 39 said they planned to make a gift. Their estimates totaled \$143,000. The interviews showed we need to emphasize how this project will add to the ministry of making disciples, not just make us more comfortable. Other helpful insights came out of the report.

Reactions at the meeting included responses that this was a hopeful and optimistic sign to proceed. Some felt if we could raise \$143,000 from 26 households, we may raise a lot more from the rest of us, and not need to borrow much. Another reaction held up the need to save investments and not use them for this project since they seemed to be marked for other uses.

A written ballot was taken on a motion to proceed toward the plan. It passed. Another motion was passed to ask the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation for help organizing a fund drive, if we could do it for less than \$18,000.

The building committee now needs to decide on a contractor and a fund drive plan before the church votes. The vote would be on both the architectural and finance plan. If that vote passes, we would do the fund drive, and get final complete architectural plans, and then vote again on the final plan.

When Jean and George learned that their church was serious about a building project to add an elevator to their building, they decided to offer a gift of appreciated stock. Originally, they included instructions in their will to give the church these shares of stock that had appreciated to four times over their initial purchase price. George suggested they give the stock to the church now so that they could see their gift in action and give the new "Elevator Fund" a boost. Jean agreed saying, "I'm so thankful we're finally going to have this elevator. I'd rather see our gift help this elevator become a reality than to give it through our estate after we're gone."

If you've owned shares of appreciated stock for at least a year and a day, you can use these shares of stock to make a charitable gift and avoid paying up to 15% in capital gains taxes. This means by giving stock as a gift, you're able to make a larger gift than if you wrote a check for the same amount of cash.

If you process your stock gifts through the Wisconsin U.M. Foundation, you do not pay a selling fee or commission. This also means you're able to give a larger gift when the church receives 100% of the proceeds from the sale of your shares of stock.

Perhaps God is calling you to give some shares of stock to make a gift to the general operating fund of the church, to the building project, or to a special mission project. You can also use appreciated stock to establish a Permanent Endowment Fund, which will provide gifts to your church or another favorite ministry from now into eternity.
